3 Questions With ... Philanthropist Jacqueline (Jackie) Scott, JD, ML

## what moves you to give your time, talent and financial resources?

My faith, a sense of humility, and a sense of responsibility to give back. My faith grounds and guides me. I maintain a level of humility in all that I am and all that I do, recognizing that each of us are a small part of something much bigger, yet we each have a responsibility to do our part. If doors were not opened for me, if someone had not taken the time to truly "see me", I would not have been able to accomplish half of what I have today. I am passionately driven by, and compelled by a sense of responsibility to, and for, others.



## when did you start giving to issues that are important to you?

Honestly, I was probably about 10 or 11 years old. I would help my grandmother prepare meals and "care baskets" for women who lived in a boarding house down the street from her. At the time I considered it a chore that needlessly took me away from playing with my friends. It wasn't until my grandmother challenged me to use a portion of my allowance to buy anything I wanted to contribute to the baskets, that I realized just what it meant to make a difference. I purchased fingernail polish and candy for each. They loved it. I realized then what it meant to give of myself to bring joy to someone else. I've been hooked ever since.



## what advice do you have for those interested in giving back?

Never underestimate your ability to make a difference. Often people talk themselves out of giving back because they feel what they have is "not enough" to make a difference. Not enough money, not enough time, not enough "know how"... Bottom line – find a place to start, connect to something you can relate to and that energizes you. Begin small so you are not overwhelmed by the commitment – but by all means, begin.
