Others wish them ill and they deserve someone to stand by them and take on those in their way.



when did you start giving to issues that are important to you?

I have been volunteering all my adult life, though with my own children grown and flown, I have more time to devote championing the cause of LGBTQ+ young people and helping elevate their voices against their oppression. Now that legislatures across our country are trying to pass laws to prevent these children from living their lives as their genuine selves, this work has become increasingly important.



what advice do you have for those interested in giving back?

For me, my experience as a queer person and my position as a teacher gave me a special perspective on how our culture's somewhat rigid gender norms affect LGBTQ+ children. It became obvious that they need someone in their corner and my unique experience and set of skills meant that I needed to step up.
